The Environmental Impact Assessment.

The Environmental Impact Associated with the installation has been reviewed. There are sensitive receptors located near to the installation these being domestic housing Leys Road and Moore Street plus the Stourbridge Cannel.

Potential Health impact from air emission to humans.

The Company has received four complaints since 1995 from the local residents reference dust emission. The last complaint being made in 1997. The Company has overcome this issue by the purchase of abaitment equipment bag unit.

Noise

Potential nuisance impact from noise/vibration receptors since 1995 the Company has received 6 complaints reference noise from the Leys Road area. The last one being in 2000, the Company has resolved these problems with the employment of acoustic booths and controlling transportation hours in 1996. The Company was served with an Enforcement Notice for Unit 1A, this has been licensed to a Sub-contractor.

Potential harm to ecosystems/aquatic life Stourbridge Cannel.

The Company was taken to court in 1995 by the National Rivers Authority due to oil in the Stourbridge Cannel. This has been overcome and is not likely to reoccur as bunding has been erected to prevent reoccurrence.

- Contribution to global warming from emissions associated with energy use.
 The Company is committed to reduce energy wherever practically possible and has entered into UK 2010 Climate Change Agreement. Please refer to document Reference B2.7.
- Our assessments show that the largest impact to the local community would be a major fire on the site. This would effect human receptors for Leys Road and the ecosystem/aquatic life within the Stourbridge Cannel through water run off.
